The NMVCA has awarded Mosquito Control Grants totaling \$10,000 over 10 years!

Zika Virus is the newest mosquitoborne virus to enter the U.S. According to www.cdc.gov, the Zika Virus is spread through the bite of an Aedes aegypti or Aedes albopictus mosquito. The most common symptoms are mild fever, rash and joint pain lasting a few days. Only 1 in 5 with the disease show symptoms. The virus remains in the human blood system for a few days. Deaths are rare. Recently, in South & Central America severe symptoms have been observed in newborn children from mothers infected with the virus, with symptoms including birth defects and birth complications. It is not known when during pregnancy the virus transmission from infected mother occurs.

Nebraska had 2 cases of Zika during 2017 and all were travel-related. The container-breeding *Aedes aegypti* and *Aedes* albopictus mosquitoes are rarely found in Nebraska and so mosquito transmission in Nebraska will be unlikely. Florida had the highest number of cases in 2017 and all were travel-related. Puerto Rico had Zika cases that were transmitted by *Aedes* mosquitoes on the island.

West Nile Virus will be more

important for Nebraskans since the *Culex* mosquitoes that can transmit this virus are very abundant. Most people infected with West Nile Virus show no symptoms. People with mild infections will have a fever, body aches and rash. Severe infections develop quickly with severe headaches, fever, disorientation and convulsions.

Nebraska is in the top 3 states in total cases, deaths and positive blood donors. In 2017, Nebraska had 68 cases of West Nile Virus with 2 deaths and 18 positive blood donors. Nebraska averages over 100 cases per year with 2 deaths per year and 15 positive blood donors per year. The West Nile Virus cases peak during the fall months when the *Culex* mosquitoes are most abundant. *Culex* mosquitoes lay their eggs on standing, stagnant water in both irrigated agricultural fields and containers.
