June 7-10, 2016

The goal of these workshops is to provide training necessary to help deal with community mosquito control problems, including NPDES issues. Topics to be covered include mosquito biology, larviciding, adulticiding, pesticide safety, NPDES regulations and public relations. These workshops are open to all interested individuals. The educational portion for all four workshops will be from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Calibration and droplet testing of spray trucks will occur in the afternoon at each site. Michael Stromer, NMVCA Board Member, provided the following update for the **National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES):** Senate Bill S.1500 was introduced to the Senate on 06/03/2015, was directed to the Environment and Public Works committee for review, passed out of the Senate - Environment and Public Works Committee and passed out of committee to the full Senate on Oct. 29, 2015 with no amendment. On that date, Oct 29th, S.1500 was placed on the legislative calendar under General Orders. The legislative update page url for the bill is found at:

Zika Virus is the newest

mosquito-borne virus to enter the U.S. According to www.cdc.gov, the Zika Virus is spread through the bite of an *Aedes* mosquito. The most common symptoms are mild fever, rash and joint pain lasting a few days. Only 1 in 5 with the disease show symptoms. The virus remains in the human blood system for a few days. Deaths are rare. Recently, in South & Central America severe symptoms have been observed in newborn chidren from mothers infected with the virus, with symptoms including birth defects and birth complications. It is not known when during pregnancy the virus transmission from infected mother occurs.

Currently, there are no vaccines for Zika Virus. Treatment of the symptoms is the course of action.

Zika Virus was prevalent in Africa and SE Asia but in 2015 was found in South & Central America (see Map below). As of late January 2016, transmission in United States has not occurred but a handful of travelers from endemic regions have have tested positive for the virus.

The *Aedes* mosquitoes that can transmit Zika Virus are commonly found throughout southern U.S. and so future transmission in those areas is likely. However, these container-breeding, day-time flying *Aedes* are rarely found in Nebraska and the upper Midwest. When traveling in affected areas, the best prevention is to reduce skin exposure and to use repellents.
