The NMVCA has awarded Mosquito Control Grants totaling \$11,000 over 11 years!

Floods: The recent floods have been devastating to many Nebraska communities. Concerns have been raised about the flood and subsequent standing water on the abundance of mosquitoes this year. As of mid-April, it has been too cool across Nebraska for mosquito activity. We normally begin to see mosquitoes in mid-May, depending on temperature. Therefore, it is difficult to estimate mosquito abundance at this time. As the temperatures become consistently warmer, be vigilant in your surveillance efforts.

West Nile Virus: In 2018,

Nebraska had one of its worst years for West Nile Virus (WNV). Nebraska had 245 human cases (most in the United States in 2018), 11 deaths (tied for most with Illinois), and 46 blood donors positive for WNV (most in the US).

The cases primarily occurred in eastern Nebraska. The WNV was observed earlier than normal. It is thought that the timing of significant weather events attributed to the 2018 WNV surge. Eastern Nebraska had higher than normal temperatures which could have accelerated the mosquito abundance. June had higher than normal rain which provided abundant larval habitat. It is too early in the season to predict WNV abundance for 2019.

Nebraska continues to be top 3 in the US with total cases, deaths and positive blood donors. Nebraska averages over 100 cases per year with 2 deaths per year and 15 positive blood donors per year. The West Nile Virus cases peak during the fall months when the *Culex* mosquitoes are most abundant. Culex mosquitoes lay their eggs on standing, stagnant water in both irrigated agricultural fields and containers. The WNV will continue to be important for Nebraskans since the *Culex* mosquitoes that can transmit this virus are very abundant. Most people infected with West Nile Virus show no symptoms. People with mild infections will have a fever, body aches and rash. Severe infections develop quickly with severe headaches, fever, disorientation and convulsions.
